THE COLLECT

As the sick, the disabled, the outcast leper, the mentally disturbed, the homeless, the refugees and the displaced were brought to Christ for healing, so we bring before the Lord in prayer the disease and suffering of our world and ask for his healing and salvation.



We pray for diseased countries: ruled with injustice; cowed by fear; chained by oppression: for Ukraine, Russia, Palestine, Israel, Ethiopia, Sudan, etc.

We pray for sick societies; where possessions are put first; where children are abused; where violence stalks the streets.

We pray for suffering people: the malnourished and starving; the victims of warfare; the victims of natural disaster.

We pray for those who are ill: people we know well; people we know only by name; members of this congregation.

We pray for the disabled: seeking fulfilment; seeking understanding; seeking dignity and self-worth.

We pray for those distressed in mind: the bereaved; the depressed and anxious; the hurt and afraid.

We pray for those who seek salvation: those longing for forgiveness; those longing for meaning and a sense of purpose; those longing to know God.

We pray for all those who work to bring healing and wholeness into the lives of nations, of communities, of families and of individuals. We pray for those who bear Christian witness to the salvation to be found through Jesus Christ, as they spread the gospel in word and action, through teaching and preaching, through loving and through healing the sad and the sick.

Loving heavenly Father, through your Son, Jesus Christ, you met the needs of those who called upon you with an out-flowing of your health-giving love. In his name we put into your caring hands the sickness and the suffering of the world. Amen.
